

A webinar on circumcision was convened by Dr Gyanendra Sharma. Circumcision is not discussed in detail routinely. Everyone was surprised that the time of two hours was not enough for discussion on this topic of common interest. Dr Arvind Ganpule convened a webinar on urological infection. It was well attended.

We are all looking forward to our annual conference at Nashik this September.

The council is coming out with an exciting program.

TREADING THE TREASURER'S TRAIL

It all started with the whole hearted support of all of you in October 2020.

After getting into the seat of my friends and kind predecessors I started my journey which an aim to push in some economic reforms in the zone. This included making the financial management of our society more lucid and user friendly. Little did we know of what was to come during the dark times of COVID lock downs. Issues with the bank understaffing and economic turmoil that lead to drastic changes in the banking norms, rules and patterns. Yet as we strived against all the odds, the West Zone council was always there and supporting as we attempted to bring in a few things in the days to follow. I think it is time that all of you got an update from my desk.

My tenure started off with making a working SOP for the treasurer which would define the exact role of the treasurer in the council. We focused, achieved and converted our banking system into an online account by incorporating net banking facilities. We have adopted a universal bank for this facility which allows functioning from any geographical place in the zone. Paperless accounting is being followed now and hardly any cheques are signed during transactions as all the payments are done online. The advantage of the same was experienced during the GOA conference as all the conference payments, prize monies etc were done securely with a click of the mouse. Transferring the financial powers to the incoming newly elected treasurer or secretary has always been a task specially with the new banking norms. Bur now with netbanking in place it is just about passing on the login ID and the password to the incoming treasurer and he/she can start operating the accounts from the next moment.

Now the President, Secretary and the treasurer have a dedicated sim card which allows OTP acquisition for bank matters easy. This mobile hand set which has the bank OTP softwares available can also be easily handed over to the incoming council. This would also make handing over the account handles to my successors smooth and seamless.

We have set up a dedicated email account and a cell number for the treasurer which has helped smoothen out the treasurer's office activity.

All the financial accounts of our zone are now maintained in tally (an accounting software) in the treasurer's office and transfer of all the financial details is easy, making it a paperless office.

We have made certain changes in the conference accountings vide which each state of our zone now has a separate GST number and a conference account which would be maintained forever. This drives in a ready financial platform for the state bodies to organize Zonal workshops, CMEs, CUEs, workshops etc. This would also introduce accountability of the transactions and reduce the hassles of closing the bank accounts and the GSTs after every conference. At the same time this would help data mining and preserve the records just in case government compliance crop up at some later date. It is has indeed been a lovely trail so far, full of experiences, leaning and sweet fruits with we being able to achieve quite a few milestones. Nothing is possible without proactive support of the president secretary and the council. I would continue to do the same till the end of my tenure as I look forward to more ideas which can be incorporated.

First Physical conference after the Pandemic!

The thirty first annual conference of Urological society of India West Zone was held at the Taj Resort and Convention Centre, Goa from 1st to 3rd October 2021. This was attended by 229 physical delegates and more than 300 (D1:325; D2:381, D3: 411) virtual delegates. This was the first physical conference after the travel restrictions due to the pandemic. The conference was brought to life with planning of just 3-4 weeks. The venue was nestled amidst the hilly forestland and overlooking sandy trails that welcome the Arabian waves. It was in the capital city of Goa, Panji. Most of the rooms had a panoramic view of the sea. The transition of sun from dawn to dusk viewed from the rooms was magical.

The Inauguration

The inaugural function was graced by Dr Madhav Kamat who spoke of growth of urology practice in India and west zone in particular in his inaugural address. USI president Dr C Malikarjuna enjoyed the west zone conference to the fullest and praised the arrangements in the conference. A special issue of newsletter dedicated to urology education, which was edited by Dr Ravindra Sabnis, was unveiled by Dr Keshavmurthy, Secretary USI. Dr Pankaj Maheshwari and Dr Kandarp Parikh were awarded urology gold medal for 2020 and 2021 respectively. The honour of services award was bestowed upon Dr Bhalchandra Kashyapi for his continuing social services. A kevnote address on Goa by Mr Sanjeev Sardesai was praised by all. This was followed by Goan dance by a dance troupe and banquet.

Day One

The conference scientific program was meticulously crafted by Dr Anil Bradoo, President and Dr Prashant Mulawkar, Secretary. A member preferences survey was conducted beforehand and responses received were used to design the scientific program. Various topics in the scientific program were colour coded according to the subspeciality covered.

The conference started on 1st October post lunch with a free paper session. More than 90% of the presenters were physically present. This was followed by a short welcome speech from the team. The plenary sessions started with discussion of impact of COVID pandemic on urology practice and urologist as an individual. A two hour semi live surgery session was scheduled after this. This session included demonstrations of surgeries from reimplantation, to transplant to RIRS in tricky situations. Session titled 'play safe' comprising of practical medico legal and financial tips followed this session. Dr Mahesh Desai delivered an invited talk as a tribute to Dr Shyam Joshi.

Day Two

The second day started with free paper session and a session discussing nuances of technological failure of the equipment intra-op and how to overcome the obstacles with simple tips and tricks and ready in hand substitutes was liked by many. The prestigious Dr V V Desai oration was delivered by Dr Lalit Shah who spoke about the issues faced by practicing urologists. Dr A G Phadke memorial oration was delivered by Dr Ashish Kamat who took un through a journey of advances in bladder cancer management in last thirty years. This was immediately followed by guest talks on biomarkers and narrow band imaging in bladder cancer. Dr Andreas Gross talked about future of stone management. An hour of interesting session titled 'Hey! Can you do it netter than me?' followed this session. In this common clinical scenario in urological practice and solutions to these were discussed. 'Point of no return' was an practical session on avoiding and managing disastrous complications. A talk show "Gen Nxt" with interaction of two generations of urologists in a family with live interviews of the participants followed next and it came as a stress buster for the audience midst serious academic discussions. A summary of various USI guidelines was presented in a session presided by Dr N P Gupta. The Karanjawala symposium was moderated by Dr Ganesh Bakshi. The panel covered all aspects of cancer penis right form diagnosis to management. Senior teacher Dr Umesh Oza was felicitated in "Know your Guru". This session was presided by Dr Bradoo and Dr Mulawkar and moderated by Dr Bhalchandra Kashyapi and Dr Dhananjay Bokare. Cultural program comprising musical and dance performances by the members was held on day two evening.

Day Three

The last day started with free paper session and online quiz which was conducted by Dr Jayesh Dhabaliya, Dr Prakash Pawar and Dr Ravi Jain. Theme based debates, hard talk and a symposium on career in urology was attended by many. The journey of development of surgical procedures was discussed in a thought provoking session titled 180 degree- 360 degree. This was followed by a short but important session on female pelvic floor and a talk show discussing retirement plans by urologists. A symposium on major complications of PCNL moderated by Dr Kumar Naik and Dr Kaushik Shah was the last program of the conference.

The new team of USIWZ headed by Dr Jaikrishin Lalmalani took over the charge during the valedictory function.

The conference received good support from the industry despite short notice. The delegates praised the conference venue, food and personal touch in the arrangements.

JUGAAD INNOVATIONS IN UROLOGY

Surgical instrument and equipment malfunction and damage can occur during any surgical procedure. Diversified instruments and equipments make surgery easier but can also bring with it some technical problems. The overall incidence of critical adverse events associated with defective surgical instruments including all types of surgery is 10 in every 100000 operations (0.01%). The incidence of defective instruments in urological and endoscopic surgery is 0.31% and 0.53% respectively.

As urologist we utilize more technology, more devices and more mechanical innovations than any other branch of surgery. Our dependence on technology has made us more vulnerable to many nightmare situations. Almost every urologist faces such situation at least once in a lifetime, sooner or later.

The Hindi word 'Jugaad' describes a flexible approach to problem solving that uses limited resources in an innovative way. Jugaad is, quite simply, a unique way of thinking and acting in response to challenges. The word jugaad carries a slightly negative connotation for some but Jugaad is practiced by almost all Indians in their daily lives to make the most of what they have.

In this article we will focus on some jugaad innovations to creatively address intraoperative instrument and equipment malfunction. Some of these innovations may not be relevant to fully equipped (including laser machine) centres but they are still relevant to a roaming urologist.

Q. What would you do if your pneumatic lithotripsy probe breaks down during surgery?

If you don't have Laser machine and your lithotripsy probe has broken down during a surgery then you may have a suboptimal result. In such a situation a rubber loop can be used to fix broken probe to hand piece to rescue oneself. Fixed lithotripsy probe will deliver adequate ballistic energy required for fragmentation of the stone.






Figure: A - Broken lithoclast probe, B - Probe fixed with rubber loop to hand piece

- **Q.** What would you do if your lithoclast foot switch suddenly stops working?
- A. Disconnect foot switch from its knob in control unit. Place an artery forceps in the knob and hold both the ends with its jaws to complete the electric circuit. As a result the control unit will automatically deliver power as per your settings without need of foot switch.

Q. What if your lithoclast control unit doesn't work at all?

A. It is very difficult to manage such a situation. Here the goal is to deliver air with high pressure to hand piece so that it can propel the bullet to generate ballistic energy. A three way cannula can be used for this purpose.

A small extension tube can also be used when metallic end of pneumatic tubing cannot be removed. One end of threeway cannula is connected with tube from cylinder and other end is connected to hand piece. The knob of cannula is moved in two directions quickly for maintaining the inflow and outflow of air. This maneuver may not generate adequate pressure but, is useful when nothing else works.

Q. If you have only one tri prong stone retrieval forceps and its prong breaks down during ureteroscopy then what would you do?

A. Stone retrieval forceps is very important accessory during ureteroscopy. If its prong breaks down then it cannot hold the stone fragment. It can be used by refashioning prongs as shown in figure. Cut the curved part of the prongs to make them of same size. Take two mosquito artery forceps and hold with one forceps and bend with other forceps to make same size curves. Now it can hold and retrieve stone fragments properly.




Figure: A -Pneumatic tubings connected with extension tube, B – Bivalve action of three way cannula, C – Hand piece with connections



Q. What if your Tuohy adapter breaks down during flexible Ureteroscopy?

A. Tuohyadapter is used to prevent the backflow of fluid around an instrument/Laser fiber inserted through the working channel of flexible ureteroscope. Backflow from a broken Tuohy adapter impairs the vision and Laser fiber may slip out during surgery. Misfire secondary to such instability can damage flexible ureteroscope. A broken adapter can be replaced by a much cheaper plastic seal of 2 cc syringe. Plastic seal fits snuggly on working channel and nicely prevent backflow.

Q. What if spring of your TURP working element breaks down during surgery?

A. Spring action of working element helps in smooth resection of prostate. If spring breaks down during surgery then resection will become difficult and it also causes fatigue. To finish the surgery smoothly spring action can be recreated by tying a rubber glove loop to the working element as shown in the figure.

Q. What if you lost your pathfinder bulb irrigator?

A. In laparoscopic surgery a preperitoneal distention balloon and inflation bulb set (PDB 1000) is used for space creation. It is a single use balloon but bulb can be used as a pathfinder bulb irrigator. At one end it is connected to ureteroscope through an extension tube (100 cm). Other end is connected to a TURP set. This bulb irrigator can be used multiple times and actually it is more durable than a pathfinder bulb irrigator.




